



Put a Face with a Name Campaign for The Education Center at The Wall

The Project: The “Put a Face with a Name” campaign is an effort to collect photographs for all 58,261 names of the men and women who made the ultimate sacrifice in the Vietnam War. These photographs will be displayed in the Education Center at The Wall, as part of the “Making the Names Visible” exhibit when the funding and construction has been completed.

The “Making the Names Visible” exhibit wall will be a two-story digital wall which will rotate the photos of the casualties on their birthdays, providing a place for loved ones and friends to visit. The exhibit will also feature the photographs combined with the values of service (service, respect, integrity, loyalty, duty, honor, courage) with personal accounts taken from letters left at The Wall.

How you can help: We need your help collecting these photos. The Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund (VVMF) has partnered with FedEx Office in order to help get these photos digitized for the Center.

If you have a photo, please fill out the photo submission form with all the information you can and take it to your local FedEx Office location. Our partners at FedEx will scan your photo and return it back to you during your visit.

- Maybe you know of a family member who still lives in the area. Encourage them to go to the FedEx location or offer to take the photo there yourself.
- Engage your local school. Tell a teacher about the project and encourage their students to do a history report on the people from their home town.
- Go to your local library. Often, local libraries will have copies of the town or city's year book. Bring the year book with you to the FedEx location.


